## **2024 Annual Report Highlights**

### **Scholarships**

Providing scholarships has always been a top priority for the Dude Ranch Foundation. We are proud to have awarded nearly half a million dollars since our inception.

In 2024, the Dude Ranch Foundation launched a new partnership with Durango Boots to administer a \$30,000 scholarship in celebration of the National Day of the Cowgirl. The inaugural recipient, Katelyn Collins, is an undergraduate at Texas Tech University, where she studies equine science and competes on the rodeo team.

For the 2024/2025 academic year, we proudly awarded scholarships to nine deserving DRF scholarship applicants, distributing a total of \$22,000 in support of their educational pursuits.

### **Horse Safety**

Our annual Horse Safety seminar covers essential risk management topics including horse handling, accident prevention, site safety, equipment checks, and guest orientation. DRA member ranches are encouraged to attend every three years to receive an official certificate.

In 2024, our DRA ranches reported more than 750,000 hours in the saddle from a total of 102,000 guests. Only 106 injuries required medical attention, meaning that for every 1,000 guests, only 1 individual required medical attention. Furthermore, participating dude ranches maintain 35-40% less than the industry standard in general liability claims.

Our Wrangler Training program offers onsite instruction in horsemanship, risk management, and emergency procedures. With nearly 1,000 wranglers trained to date, this program ensures that ranch staff are well-equipped to provide safe and memorable experiences for guests. In 2024, the Dude Ranch Foundation conducted 12 wrangler trainings with participation from 30 ranches, providing instruction and certificates to more than 200 individual wranglers.

### **Education**

Education is at the heart of the Dude Ranch Foundation's mission. At the headquarters in Cody, Wyoming, a free Western Museum preserves and shares the rich heritage of dude ranching history. Now entering its fourth edition, our Lariat Legacy magazine has been established as a premier industry publication, recognized for in-depth storytelling, valuable insights, and stunning photography. The DRF also sponsors top-tier speakers each year, ensuring ranchers and enthusiasts alike have access to meaningful learning opportunities.

### **Preservation**

Preservation is our greatest opportunity for lasting impact. Our commitment to sustainability and land protection is stronger than ever, and we are actively working to preserve the landscapes that define the Western ranching experience. We have strengthened partnerships with partners who offer valuable resources related to wildfire mitigation, legacy nutrient deductions, and forestry.

### **Fundraising**


We had a highly successful year in fundraising, and we feel the momentum building. We exceeded our budget goal by \$66k, reaching an impressive \$191k. This was largely due to a generous \$50,000 gift from longtime ranchers who deeply believe in our mission.


An additional highlight was our record-breaking WyoGives event in July, where we raised \$15,085 online in a single day. Thanks to the Hughes Charitable Foundation, \$11,000 of those funds qualified for additional boosting, securing an extra \$5,219 and bringing the WyoGives total to \$20,304.

This support affirms that our vision is within reach and underscores the importance of building a strong endowment—ensuring long-term sustainability and providing lasting resources to carry the Foundation's mission forward.
